Q. When do I need to register my child for the next hockey season and how much does it cost?

REGISTRATION DEADLINE – REGISTRATION CLOSES AUGUST 1, 2015

After August 1, acceptance is at the discretion of the Board and will be subject to a \$50.00 late fee.

Q. What method of payment is accepted?

We accept Visa, MasterCard, and Debit.

As of January 1, 2014, the NFMHA no longer accepts cash.

Q. Can I pay in instalments?

Instalment plans are not available.

Q. What is Respect In Sport – Parent Edition and is it mandatory?

Commencing the 2014 & 2015 Season, the OMHA implemented the “Respect in Hockey” initiative. This initiative requires at least one parent or guardian of each player registered in minor hockey throughout the OMHA to complete the e-learning course “Respect in Sport – Parent Program” as a condition of participation. added your child(ren) to your profile, please forward a copy of your certificate to the Niagara Falls Minor Hockey Business Office at nfmha@bellnet.ca

The cost for this course is \$12.00 + HST per family. The OMHA only accepts online credit card payments. This course is available now.

The deadline for course completion is August 1, 2015.

Q. What equipment does my child need?

Hockey stick, CSA approved helmet with face protector, mouth guard, neck guard, shoulder pads, elbow pads, hockey gloves, athletic supporter with cup/jill, hockey pants, shin guards, and skates.

Q. How do I know my registration is confirmed?

Once you have submitted your registration form online and paid in full, you will receive an electronic receipt which confirms your acceptance into Niagara Falls Minor Hockey.

Q. What equipment is supplied?

Hockey sweater and hockey socks.

Q. When will I be contacted as to what team my child is on?

IP TO BANTAM HOUSE LEAGUE REGISTRANTS: All participants should be contacted by September 20, 2015. If you have not been contacted by this date, please contact our business office at nfmha@bellnet.ca.

MIDGET AND JUVENILE-LEVEL HOUSE LEAGUE PLAYERS: All participants should be contacted by October 1, 2015. If you have not been contacted by this date, please contact the office at nfmha@bellnet.ca.

Please do not phone or email prior to these dates.

Q. When does the House League season begin?

House League hockey begins in the middle of September, **with the exception of Midget and Juvenile**. Everyone will be contacted by a coach or convenor with your start date and time.

Q. When will my child play and practice?

House League registrants play one game per week. Practices will be one day per week at a variety of times. The schedule for the 2015 & 2016 Season will not be available until September. It will be distributed by your coach.

Q. Can I specify a certain coach or team that I want my child to play for?

Unfortunately, with a registration base of 900 participants it has become impossible to accommodate special requests. We do accommodate siblings registered in the same division. If you are coaching, you can ensure your own child is on your team.

Q. Can I request that my child play with his or her friend for carpooling purposes?

Again, it is impossible to accommodate special requests. Once the first two weeks of hockey has been played and it is unworkable for you to get your child to the arena please speak with your coach and convenor, and we will try to accommodate your situation.

Q. What documentation do I need if I want to coach?

Coaches and trainers are required to attend clinics run by the Ontario Minor Hockey Association. Each level of hockey is designed with clinic specific programs. You may contact the Minor Hockey Office or OMHA directly to determine which clinics best suit your coaching/training position. Once determined, please visit our Clinics section for a complete listing of clinics offered this season by the NFMHA. Another requirement of the NFMHA and the OMHA is a criminal reference check to be obtained through the NFMHA. Please contact minor hockey for further information.

Q. Where do I sign up to be a House League Coach?

Coaching applications are available on this website and in the Minor Hockey Office. The deadline for submission is July 1, 2015.

Q. How will I find out my child's House League schedule?

Schedules will be available through your coach and convenor.

Q. Is there a league specifically for girls?

The Niagara Falls Rapids offers recreational and representative hockey for girls. They are not associated with the NFMHA, but we have a great working relationship with them. Please visit www.nfgha.com for details and contact information.

Q. What documentation do I require to claim my child's hockey registration fees on my current income tax return?

Once you have registered your child(ren) online, and paid in full, a receipt will be emailed to you. Please keep this receipt for the Children's Fitness Tax Credit.

Representative hockey players also receive a receipt upon payment of the representative hockey fee. Please include that document in your records.
