



NIAGARA FALLS MINOR HOCKEY ASSOCIATION APPAREL POLICY

The Niagara Falls Minor Hockey Association (the “NFMHA”) takes pride in its branding and image and expects its players and team officials, at all levels, to be consistently, neatly and properly attired, particularly for games.

Off-ice dress code for games

In particular, if jackets have been issued to players or team officials by the NFMHA, they must be worn, at all levels. In addition, at the representative level, business casual attire must be worn, such as khaki, corduroy or dress pants with a belt, collared shirts tucked in and dress shoes with the laces, if any, tied. No ripped clothing, jeans, shorts, t-shirts, track suits, winter boots, running shoes, sandals or hoodies.

At all other levels, it is recommended that business casual attire be worn, but not required.

Trainers may wear a NFMHA-approved track suit, purchased through the NFMHA’s apparel supplier for that or a previous season, and clean running shoes with the laces tied.

If, instead of jackets, track suits have been issued to players by the NFMHA, they must be worn, at all levels, in addition to clean running shoes with the laces tied.

Players may wear hats or toques issued to them by the NFMHA or an NFMHA-approved hat or toque, purchased through the NFMHA’s apparel supplier for that or a previous season, at all levels. Team officials may not wear hats or toques.

If players or team officials, at all levels, wish to purchase additional NFMHA attire, they must do so through the NFMHA’s apparel supplier for that season. However, if jackets or track suits have been issued to players by the NFMHA, players must be attired in a manner consistent with their teammates. In other words, it is not acceptable for some players to wear jackets, others to wear track suits, etc.

If hockey bags have been issued to players by the NFMHA, they must be used.

On-ice dress code for games

NFMHA game jerseys and socks must be worn, at all levels.

If pant shells have been issued to players by the NFMHA, they must be worn, at all levels.

Players, at all levels, must supply their own CHA or CSA approved hockey helmet and hockey gloves, which must be worn throughout the game. At the representative level, helmets and gloves must be black or black and red.

If helmet decals have been issued to players by the NFMHA, they must be affixed in locations consistent with their teammates' helmets, at all levels.

Off-ice dress code for practices

If hockey bags have been issued to players by the NFMHA, they must be used.

On-ice dress code for practices

At the representative level, NFMHA game jerseys and socks may not be worn for practices or extra ice time.

If practice jerseys have been issued to players by the NFMHA, they must be worn, at all levels.

If track suits have been issued by the NFMHA to team officials, they must be worn, at all levels. Team officials assisting on the ice must supply their own CHA or CSA approved hockey helmet and hockey gloves, which must be worn throughout the practice.
